LASERs in dentistry is fast gaining ground replacing many a traditional procedures including scalpel surgical procedures.



Out of 110 registered delegates, around 50 delegates were Interns, PG students & staff members from our college & more than 50 from other colleges of Bangalore & Tumkur.






4. Rally and Health Awareness program near BMCRI, Chamrajpet


